

Jesus Without Language

Using the Material

How to teach your child

As a parent, you know your child better than anyone else. God gave you this child; trust in that knowledge. The aim of this daily material is to give you something simple you can do to make this week special.

- Talk with your child about how this is a special week.
- Gather the materials you need and then sit down and read the talk text.
- Have your child(ren) choose what comes next a game or the activity.
- Cut out your daily card and place somewhere around the house as a reminder.
- Say the short prayer with your child.

TALK

There are two versions, one for kids and a simplified one for preschool. The daily cards contain the same text.

PLAY

Simple games you can play or activities to introduce the ideas or start discussions.

MAKE

This little activity helps the hands-on learner.

PRAY

A simple prayer to say with your child.

TINY

This sign is attached when an activity would be suitable for preschool ages.

CARD

Each day comes with a small card to cut out. The preschool ones can be found at the end of the pack. Make a ladder or a chain of these as a way of building towards Easter.



PLAY

Scatter—Pile coins on the table and then scatter them off the edge. Have your child help the temple sellers by picking up the coins.

TALK

Cuddle up and tell the story if you know it - alternatively here's a version you can use.

After Palm Sunday's great entrance today can come as a shock.

Preschool:


Jesus went to his father's house, God's house, the temple. People were excited to see Jesus but he was angry to see the people playing with money in the special building. The temple should be a place for meeting with God, not a place to have a market and get rich selling things. Jesus got so angry that he turned over the tables. Jesus wanted to clean out and tidy up the building to keep it special.

Kids:

When Jesus reached the temple, it looked a bit like a market. People were changing their coins for special temple coins and buying special temple things. Jesus got angry! People were making a lot of money with their special temple businesses. Jesus turned over the tables, sending the special temple goods and the coins flying all over the place. He shouted from the scriptures, "'My house will be called a house of prayer,' but you are making it 'a den of robbers'!"

MAKE a memory game.

You need: ten coins, post-it note, pen and scissors.




Give the children the coins with the letters face down. Ask them to describe the meaning attached to coins. Then get them to turn the coins over and find the word 'prayer'.





PLAY

Hidden light - Play hide the object using a torch or glow stick. How easy was it to find? Was it easier to find when the room was brighter? Did its light make it easier to discover?

I Packed My Bag - This classic game, also called "When I went to Grandma's" is a memory game listing all the things you'd take with you. Take turns to recite the whole list of items in the bag before listing a further item. How many can you remember?

PRAY

Lord, we do not know the future, but you do. Please help us to be ready for you when you call us. Amen.



Holy Week: Tuesday

TALK

Cuddle up and tell the story if you know it - alternatively here's a version you can use.

Now that the temple is all shook up, Jesus goes back to storytelling mode.

Preschool:

Jesus was telling his disciples stories, and today we remember one special one. It's about 10 girls who had oil lamps to take to a party. 5 girls were wise - they had brought extra oil - but 5 foolish girls didn't. All night the oil burned down and down. The 5 foolish girls had to leave to get some more oil and missed the party. Jesus doesn't want us to miss the party.

Kids:

Jesus's friends thought something big was about to happen. They asked Jesus what the end of time would be like. Jesus started to tell many parables. He told them there were ten bridesmaids waiting for the wedding. Five bridesmaids were wise and bought extra oil for their lamps. When the groom arrived, the five foolish bridesmaids had gone to find more oil. When they came to the party, the groom sent them away. Jesus was telling his friends to be prepared because they would not be told at what time the end would come.

MAKE an oil lamp.

You need: candle, dough, rolling pin and knife.



Alternatively; thick card, glue and colour pens.

Make or source your favourite dough and roll it out (or use heavy card) and cut the shape of an oil lamp. This is like a fat tear shape with a small rectangle handle at the round end. Give the youngsters the shape and a candle. Decorate the oil lamp to identify that it is theirs. Attach the candle by pushing into the centre of the dough or gluing it onto the card or hardened dough.



PLAY

Oil reveal - Grab some paper and draw a picture on one side without showing the other person. Turn the paper over and give it to another person and have them lightly brush oil over the page to find the picture. The oil is revealing just as the anointing was revealing Jesus as king.

Lord, teach us how to be people always ready to give, to share what you have given to us with your people. Teach us to honour you with the things we share. Amen.

MAKE a perfume container.

You need: jar, glue,

Cut a shape you associate with today's passage out of fabric (a jug, a cross, a crown). Make a button hole slit. Add a scent and attach to a button on your clothing to take with you through the day.

Use a glass or plastic jar and decorate with torn paper.



TALK

Preschool:

Then he said something new. Jesus told his friends that this bread was like his body and broke the bread apart, and that the wine was like his blood. He said this was a new promise from God, and that this promise would forgive people for the things they did that upset God. Then Jesus told his friends this would be his last meal with them.

MAKE a meal.

You need: red juice, frying pan, rolling pin, 2 cups of flour, 2/3 cup water, 1 tablespoon olive oil, pinch of salt

Put the juice aside.

Mix the other ingredients.

Kneed well until smooth then sit to rest for 10 minutes.


Pinch a small ball (walnut size).

(No ingredients, use whatever bread or crackers you have)





PLAY

MAKE a memory game.

You need: push pins, cork board, thin paint or ink, paper, sponge for paint.



Take the piece of paper and talk about how perfect its colour is, how clean it looks.

Push pins into the paper to form a cross. Lightly paint over the pins with a sponge. Remove the pins to show the white circles.

Let the kids make their own crosses from pins and paint, they can be intricate or simple.
