What are some things I can look for to see visible growth?

Devotion to reading Scripture

(Questions must be asked to have clarity on this)


- Lives what is read/taught
- Shares what is read/taught
- Devotion to prayer
 - Lord's prayer
 - Honest and transparent prayer
 - Missionally minded prayers
 - Prayers of repentance
 - Prayers of thanksgiving
- Devotion to worship
 - Engages and seeks worship opportunities
 Personally → Corporately → Leads others in worship
- Creates opportunities for others
 - Shift in musical preference

Devotion to accountability

- Adult initiates accountability → Talks about own
 - Student initiates accountability → Talks about own
 - Student receives accountability
- Depth of transparency
 - Move from surface/flesh struggles to root/heart struggles
- Grows the circle of accountability (counselor -> counselors)
- Holds others accountable

Devotion to community

- Bodily presence → Mental presence
- → Emotional presence → Spiritual presence
- Helps take the group, conversation and devotion deeper
- Honors parents
- Intentional with friends (displays healthy relationships)
- Brings unreached into their Biblical community
- Seeks Biblical community as they are sent and as they leave the student ministry



SEND CULTURE

What does it mean to be sent?

 Someone who realizes and engages in their role in the mission of God locally, nationally and internationally through time, talent & treasure.

Local (All Students)

- Engage with parents → Engage with class —
- → Engage with friends → Engage on their own

Local Mission Trip (6th-7th)

- Attend
- 9th-12th → Support → Plan → Train → Execute

National Mission Trip (8th)

- Attend
- 11th-12th → Support → Plan → Train → Execute

International Mission Trip (9th-12th)

- Attend (9th & 10th attend with parent)
- Support → Plan → Lead → Stay

LifeGroup Leader Expectations

- 1. Point of Contact for students under your care (Hebrews 13:17) (2 touches per week)
- Partner w/ parents in growth of student (1 touch per month)
- 3. Lead students through provided material
- 4. Provide 1 opportunity per semester outside of church events for a group gathering
- 5. Model Gospel commitment to students under your care (Imitate our Goal)
 - Vulnerable, Repentant & Humble
- 6. Earn the Right to be heard
 - Get on their level
- 7. Partner with students to help them grow in their understanding, intentionality & confidence in the Gospel, developing a disciple's heart and commissioning them each week and year.
- 8. Connect and communicate effectively with guests
- Recruit & develop LG leaders for student ministry & other church ministries
- Commit to honesty, transparency & accountability with pastors
- 11. Organize & execute one serving event for your class/ group

LifeGroup Co-Leader Expectations

- 1. Point of contact for minimum of 3 students in class
- 2. Contribute to planning & executing of the group gathering each semester
- 3. Model Gospel growth & commitment to students under your care (Imitate our Goal)
 - Understanding
 - Vulnerable, Repentant & Humble
- 4. Earn the Right to be heard
 - Get on their level
- 5. Partner with 3 students to grow deeper in their understanding, intentionality & confidence in the Gospel, developing a disciple's heart and commissioning them each week and year.
- 6. Commit to honesty, transparency & accountability with pastors
- Organize & execute one serving event for your class/ group

Ministry Team Leader Expectations

Goal - Use the ministry team to assist student's growth in their gospel understanding, discipleship and need to live sent.

- Point of Contact for students under your care (Hebrews 13:17) (1 touch per week)
- 2. Communicate practice and performance information to students and parents within proper timeframe.
- 3. Provide 1 opportunity per semester outside of church events for a team gathering
- 4. Organize & execute one serving event for your team
- 5. Model Gospel growth & commitment to students under your care (Imitate our Goal)
 - Vulnerable, Repentant & Humble

First Impressions/Assimilator

- First impression/touch for a parent & student (bears responsibility to make sure the first interaction is a win.
- 2. Collect information for Simple Church
- Connect student to appropriate LifeGroup leader/coleader
- 4. Connect student to fellow students in appropriate grade
- 5. Follow-up with student and parent post visit
- 6. Send guests thanks for visiting card
- 7. Send students birthday cards

Program Leader

- Plan, create, recruit and execute games for student service
- Make sure Bibles, pens & chairs are ready for student service
- 3. Lead small groups on nights when applicable
- 4. Sit strategically within the crowd to help with crowd control and set the pace for the environment
- 5. Counsel students on nights when there is a response time and it is needed
